

## Fire Hazards in The Sewing Room

For those of you who do not subscribe to Groupworks, there was a very important video posted on October 23, 2018. It was about making sure we do not overload electrical circuits by plugging more devices than the circuits can handle safely.

We don't think about electrical hazards — well, unless you live with an electrician or a firefighter. We plug things into our sewing room wall outlet, and then we add an extension strip and plug in more devices without considering the maximum safe AMP limits of the circuit. One tip given was to consider each breaker as an envelope of AMPS or electrical money. You do not want to spend (use) more AMP cash than you have or you could get in big trouble.

We should **ALL** make sure we are sewing in safety. Don't wait until something goes wrong. Go on Groupworks and watch this video for a basic explanation of important sewing safety information.

## Sandi's Tech Tip

Surge protectors/power strips do not last forever, and failed circuits can lead to the destruction of items they are designed to protect. Read the package insert. Most are rated for 15 amps which is the load for your home's circuit breaker, if up to code. When you plug in irons, hair dryers, vacuums and appliances into the same home circuit, it may overload your circuit. If your surge protector is also on this same circuit it

should, hopefully, shut down. Do not attempt to reset it with the same load. Unplug any heavy use item from the surge protector or use the surge protector on another outlet that is tied to a different electric panel circuit. To protect your sewing machine investment it is a good idea to replace your surge protector when



it's manufacturer warranty expires. Savvy users also tend to replace them after a serious home power surge or after using it for 5 years.
